

Call – Spring 2024







Call for Transfer Networks – Main features



- **Partnership**: 6-8 partners including Good Practice City
- Eligible Lead Partner: 116 Good Practices selected in 2024
- Eligible Partners: all EU cities, Switzerland, Norway, IPA and NDICI countries
- Duration: 30 months (from 1/11/2025 to 30/04/2028)
- **Budget**: 750 000€





WHY APPLY TO A TRANSFER NETWORK?

URBACT Good Practice City

- To **lead & mentor the process** of understanding, adapting and reusing your good practice.
- To benefit from visibility & communication activities at EU and national levels
- To try out new methods related to your Good Practices thanks to **Testing Actions**
- To **upscale and improve the Good Practice** thanks to the URBACT method & inputs from other EU cities
 - ✓ Benefit from the support of URBACT experts
 - Benefit from the involvement of local stakeholders
 - ✓ Enjoy a safe space for experimentation

Transfer Cities

- To adapt & re-use a tested and effective practice in their own city context
- To tackle a specific policy challenge with an integrated and sustainable solution
- To learn from the process & document it through a Transfer Plan





How to transfer? A 30-month 3-stage journey







Eligibility Criteria (as set out in the Terms of Reference)

- The application package submitted in English, respecting the procedure and within the notified deadline;
- The **application package is complete** including the required documents;
- The proposal is complete in terms of information and data required in the documents;
- The proposal brings together between 6 and 8 partners including the Lead Partner;
- The proposed partnership does **not include more than 1 non-city partner**;
- The proposed partnership respects the minimum of partners from Transition and Less Developed Regions as regards the partners from EU Member States;
- The candidate Lead Partner is a candidate Lead Partner in one URBACT proposal only under this call;
- The candidate Lead Partner has been awarded with an URBACT Good Practice label in 2024;
- All candidate **partners are eligible** according to the URBACT Programme rules;
- The partnership does not include more than one partner from the same country;
- The maximum budget for Transfer Networks (EUR 750.000 total eligible budget) has been respected.





Assessment criteria (as set out in the Terms of Reference)

An URBACT External Assessment Panel (EAP) reviews and scores the applications against the following criteria:

- 1) Relevance of the policy issue addressed (10%)
- 2) Transfer Potential (30%)
- 3) Quality of the partnership (25%)
- 4) Quality of planned activity and outputs (15%)
- 5) Quality of the proposed network management (10%)
- 6) Quality of the proposed budget (10%)





BUDGET & EXPERTISE





Financial resources for the network



Network Budget: 750 000€

(total incl. local co-financing)

Costs covered:

- staff costs
- admin costs
- travel & accommodation
- external expertise
- small equipment
- Subsidy + local contributions
- To be divided among all partners

 \rightarrow Lead partners should foresee 2 full-time equivalent posts for the overall management & coordination / Partners – 1 full-time equivalent

Expertise: 120 000€

- 160 days in total to support the network
- Support by a Lead Expert for 30 months
- Support by Ad hoc experts on any relevant subject
- Managed directly by the Secretariat

Additional envelope of 120 000€ for expertise support > Up to 160 expertise days available

- Network Lead expert supports the network over the <u>entire</u> <u>duration of the network</u>
- Several network Ad-Hoc Experts providing specific support on a particular policy subject, methodology, communications...
- Experts are selected from the URBACT IV pool of validated experts available on URBACT website in the upcoming months





Lead Expert Selection

- Expertise needs and criteria for the selection of network experts shall be provided in the application form based on URBACT expertise framework outlined in the ToR and Guide
- 2. After the approval of Transfer Networks, experts validated in the URBACT pool will be invited to express their interest in becoming Lead Expert of a Transfer Network
- **3. URBACT Secretariat will check suitability** in coherence with the Application Form
- 4. Final selection agreed with the Lead partner based on interviews with candidates






Call for Transfer Networks – The 2025 Timeline



- 1st April: Launch of the Call
- **30**th June: Deadline to submit applications (via Synergie)
- 1st July: Deadline to submit applications (via email)
- July-August: Eligibility Check & Assessment
- Early October: Approval by MC
- Late October: selection of the Network Lead Expert

- 1st November: Transfer Network Start Date
- **3-4 December**: Kick-Off Meeting in Paris (for LP & LE)



Submission procedure (Lead partner's responsibility)

The application is carried out <u>digitally</u> through an online platform and in email as follows:

1 - Online submission of the <u>application form</u> through the SYNERGIE-CTE system in English by 30th June 2025 at 15:00 CET

• information on the SYNERGIE system outlined in the Guide to SYNERGIE (available on urbact.eu/get-involved)

2 - Send the application package by email to TN@urbact.eu

in English by 1st July 2025 at 15:00 CET

- including scan of the signed PDF of the application generated through SYNERGIE-CTE
- signed letters of commitment from Lead Partner and all Project Partners in the Synergie
- CV of the project coordinator of the Lead Partner

Which countries can participate?

Institutions from:

- 1. 27 EU Members States
- 2. Partner States (Switzerland and Norway)
- Albania, Bosnia and Herzegovina, Montenegro, North Macedonia and Serbia (countries benefitting from the Instrument for Pre-Accession to the EU)
- 4. Ukraine and Moldova (countries benefiting from the Neighbourhood, Development and International Cooperation Instrument)







- ✓ **Only cities with a 2024 URBACT Good Practice can be Lead Partners** under this call
- A city can be a candidate Lead Partner of one Transfer Network proposal only (but can be additionally a Project Partner in another network)
- ✓ A beneficiary can be a partner in max. 2 approved networks
- ✓ A partnership cannot include more than one partner from the same country
- 1 "non-city partner" allowed per network

Geographical balance

- a network must involve partners from <u>at least 6 different countries (in case of a 6 partners)</u>, of which <u>at least 2 from EU</u> <u>Member States (including the Good Practice city)</u>
- from the EU partners (minimum 2, maximum all partners), <u>at least half should be located in Less Developed and</u> <u>Transition EU Regions</u>.

>>> In terms of assessment, it is recommended to build a diverse partnership







Who is the Lead Partner?

- Only cities with a 2024 URBACT Good
 Practice can be Lead Partners
- A city can be a candidate Lead Partner of <u>one</u> Transfer Network proposal only (but can be additionally a Project Partner in another network)





Lead Partner role and responsabilities

Lead Partners are key actors of transnational partnerships for Transfer Networks.

They have full responsibility for:

- ✓ network management,
- \checkmark coordination of activities among the transnational partners, and
- ✓ implementation of the work programme.

The Lead Partner also bears **financial and legal responsibility and liability** for the whole partnership towards the Managing Authority.

Lead Partners complete and submit the Application form and all requested documents to the URBACT Joint Secretariat



Who can be a **Project Partner?**

 City or non-city partner who answer the eligibility requirements





City? Non-City?


« CITIES » :

- Cities, municipalities, towns
- Local agencies defined as public or semi-public organisations set up by a city
- Infra-municipal tiers of government such as city districts and boroughs
- Metropolitan authorities and organised agglomerations

No limitations in terms of size and population

« NON - CITIES » :

- Universities and research centres
- Provincial/ Regional authorities
- Managing Authorities (EU Cohesion and solidarity funds)

Keep in mind the ASSESSMENT CRITERIA

Criterion 2: Transfer Potential (30%)

For this criterion, assessors will more especially consider the following dimensions:

Clear description of the Good Practice Relevant local context and stakeholders

Realistic transfer risks and challenges Motivation and ability to undertake the activities

Good Practice answers challenges of Transfer Cities Willingness of Good Practice City to transfer and to learn from Transfer Cities

Creating the network has added value for the Good Practice





Keep in mind the ASSESSMENT CRITERIA

Criterion 3: Quality of the Partnership (25%)

For this criterion, assessors will more especially consider the following dimensions:

It is coherent for cities to work together The added value and potential for change in Transfer Cities Involvement of newcomers (not yet funded under URBACT IV)

Balanced geographical coverage





Keep in mind the RELEVANCE

- The challenge addressed is a priority for all network partners.
- The **experiences of all network partners are relevant** and will contribute to the learning process of the whole partnership.
- For certain topics the size and positioning of the city could be important comparable elements for the coherence check of partners' local situations i.e. maritime cities working on maritime issues.
- There is a clear understanding of the **added value** an involvement in an URBACT network will bring to the partner in relation to respective capacity building needs.

Keep in mind the ELIGIBILITY

• A city can be a Lead Partner in <u>only one network proposal</u>

(and project partner in another network)

A city can be a Project Partner in only two <u>approved</u> networks





Tips for candidate Project Partners

Demonstrate relevance

- How is the policy challenge relevant for you?
- What is your experience on the topic? (e.g. existing policies, strategies and actions developed by your city in relation to the policy challenge)
- How is your city relevant to adapt and transfer the target innovation?

Demonstrate motivation

- What is your motivation to join this network?
- What is the added value that URBACT would bring to the city in terms of learning and capacity-building?
- What do you expect from a transnational network?

Demonstrate commitment

- What could be the scope of the Transfer plan to be produced within the framework of the network?
- Which resources (human, time, financial) are you willing to engage?
- Who are you envisioning in the initial URBACT Local Group?
- What is your experience in working through transnational exchange?





Tips for candidate Lead Partners

Check for multiple commitments of Project Partners



- o Perform expected activities and tasks at transnational and local level
- Engage with local stakeholders
- Mobilise the resources needed (human, time and financial)





Tips for candidate Lead Partners

Draft a QUESTIONNAIRE based on the application form requirements

- Example of Questionnaire template provided in the Guide for Applicants (page 28)
- Test responsiveness
- Analyse profiles (commitment, motivation, needs, added value)
- Gather a shortlist of partner candidates
- Make final selection for the network proposal

7 Tips for a great partnership

- 1. There is no such thing as the "perfect size"
- 2. Ensure the geographical balance!
- 3. Welcome newcomers!
- 4. Test the **commitment**
- 5. Beware of not-responsive partners
- 6. Connect to the **available resources** (Good Practice database, URBACT Secretariat, National URBACT Points...)
- 7. Take time to **know the partner**
